In 2016 the Trust has made a donation of £10000 to the school to enable the school to upgrade a number of computers around the school.


In 2015 the Trust made a grant of £113000 to the school to carry out long overdue works to refurbish two of the Chemistry laboratories and the adjoining Prep room.

This work was carried out during the Summer Holidays of 2015 and was completed on time and on budget ready for the start of the September 2015 term.

These refurbishments have greatly enhanced the teaching experience for Staff and Students alike.


In 2014 the Trust donated £24000 to the school to purchase a new Minibus (pictured below).




In 2004, the School celebrated its Centenary and a Development Appeal was launched to build a multi-purpose Hall and Theatre, later named the Cavanna Centenary Hall.

The Trust played a full part in supporting this and all monies donated were channelled through the Trust to take advantage of the Gift Aid scheme.

This excellent building was opened by the Earl of Wessex in March 2008 and now provides a much-needed facility for both the school and local community.
