Nature of support 2014/2015

Support is being tailored to the individual needs of the individual students where practical.

Specific support areas include:

One to one learning support in Maths and English to support in numeracy and literacy

One to one supported study to aid learning in subject areas as the need is identified

Financial support for equipment, trips and music tuition

Free attendance at Summer Camp for eligible students prior to joining year 7

One to one pastoral support from the school 'in-house' counselling team

Counselling Service at Torquay Boys' Grammar School

In 2014/2015 we will continue to offer a free service to further support the pastoral care that is already available to students at Torquay Boys' Grammar School.

During adolescence life should be easy but inevitably circumstances arise in a young person's life that throws things off balance, the usual ups and downs in life suddenly become much harder to deal with.

At Torquay Boys' Grammar School we have a robust pastoral care system, which includes a full time counsellor, who are able to offer support, to help students explore ways in which they might make things better for themselves. The cost of the Pastoral Team is part funded from Pupil Premium income.

Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium spending

TBGS measures the impact of the support provided by employing a robust system of tracking the progress of all students on a termly basis.

We identify any student for whom we receive Pupil Premium to ascertain if they require additional support. Additional support is then targeted as appropriate.

We also monitor and support any student accessing pastoral support and their progress and needs are regularly reviewed.
