I moved to Torquay from London in 1988 and joined the Torquay Boys' Grammar School Parents Association. I became Chair of the Association leaving in in 1991.

I became a governor at Torquay Boys' Grammar School in 1991 and a trustee when the Multi-Academy Trust was formed. I was previously Vice-Chair of the Trust before being selected as Chair in 2020.

In 1995 I became Chair of the newly formed TBGS Charitable Trust; this trust is dedicated to overseeing fundraising for Capitol development. In 1999 I was elected as a Torbay Councillor and held the Portfolio for Education later adding the one for Tourism. I held both of these before becoming Mayoress in 2003/2004.

I have had a lifelong interest in education and child welfare and, before retiring, was the Manager of Relate South Devon; a service dedicated to community and family support.

I grew up in the local area attending Torquay Boys' Grammar School in the late 90's before reading Law at Kingston University and completing my Post Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice at Plymouth University. I returned to Devon in January 2010 upon qualification as a solicitor. I am a partner at Wollens Solicitors. I am a Full member of the Society of Trust and Estate Practitioners. I am involved in the training and mentoring of young lawyers and am very keen to encourage others into the profession. I work with local education providers to provide guidance and advice to those interested in a career in law. I am passionate ensuring that young people, whatever their backgrounds are provided with the tools to achieve their goals.

I became a community governor at Torquay Boys' Grammar School in 2017, am a past chair of both the Personnel and Finance committees and in 2020 was appointed Vice-Chair of governors. I became a trustee of the Multi-Academy Trust in 2018 and in 2020 was appointed Vice-Chair. I am a trustee for the Torbay Medical Research Fund, which funds research into local medical projects, and I am also the present Honorary Secretary of the Torquay Old Grammarians Society. I am a member of the Executive Committee of Torbay Business Forum

and the League Liaison for Torbay Hockey Club. In my spare time, I enjoy time with my young family in and around the beautiful county of Devon, classical music, musical theatre, raising money for local charities and watching sports, particularly cricket and American Football.

I am also a governor on the Torbay's Virtual School Governing Body that scrutinises in detail the education provision and outcomes for children who are looked after. Passionate about the importance of the highest quality of education in the growth and development of all our young people and preparing them for the challenges the future will bring. Born and raised in Torquay, I was previously a Director of the Specialist Leisure Group and former Managing Director of Shearings Hotels Ltd. After leaving school I completed an Ordinary National Diploma in Business Studies at South Devon College, followed by a Higher National Certificate in Business Studies at Exeter College. I then completed a Diploma in Management Studies course at Plymouth Polytechnic, all while training as a manager at a local holiday business.

I have forty years' experience working full time in the holiday leisure sector. My first ever job was at Beesons Holiday Centre, which was located in Kingskerswell Road in Torquay.

When the Ladbroke Group acquired Beesons Holiday Centre in 1981, it opened up a number of new career opportunities for me. I spent the next eight years managing various holiday villages and catering concessions, including those located at Kew Gardens and the Tower of London. In 1990 I joined the Specialist Leisure Group.

During my career, I worked my way up through the ranks to become the Managing Director of Shearings Hotels Ltd, part of the Specialist Leisure Group. I am passionate about the area and greatly enjoyed being part of that industry for so long. As Managing Director at Shearings Hotels, I provided comprehensive oversight of the hotel operations for the 50 hotels located all around the UK, which had a turnover of circa £68M and employing over 1,600 staff. I retired from this role in 2018.

Having spent ten years on the Board of Governors at South Devon College where I was the Chair up until July 2010, I became the Chair of the Board of Governors at Torquay Academy in January 2010. I also became a Trustee of the TBGS Multi-Academy Trust in 2013 when the school joined our new partners, Torquay Boys' Grammar School. I was educated at Audley Park, now known as Torquay Academy, and have a very long connection with the school. I am passionate about the need to provide the best possible education for all the young people in our community, whatever their backgrounds, and am determined to make a positive difference, wherever I can.

In addition to my roles at the schools I am also the Chair of the Torquay Economic Development Company Ltd; a not-for-profit company, owned by Torbay Council and responsible for amongst other things the regeneration of Torbay.

In February 2020 I was also appointed Chair of the Torquay Town Deal Board, which has recently successfully secured £22 million towards the regeneration of Torquay Town Centre.

In November 2020, I was delighted to have been appointed as the new Chair of Young Devon, who support so many young people across Devon, Plymouth and Torbay. They have been finding new and different ways to help young people thrive for 70 years and are passionate about putting young people at the heart of Devon.

I also joined the Board of the Heart of the South West Local Enterprise Partnership in December 2020. Since being appointed I have become Chair of the Skills Advisory Panel, for the Heart of the South West LEP.

At the start of 2021, I became the Chair of Visit Devon, a leading destination management organisation representing over 600 businesses from the visitor economy across the county. I am still
